The fifth edition of the **CESLAM Kathmandu Migration Conference** organized by the Centre for the Study of Labour and Mobility (CESLAM) at Social Science Baha was successfully held on **Wednesday**, **15 February 2023**. The conference was organized as an online event held on Zoom. The conference was held for three and a half hours from 2:00 to 5:40 pm Nepal time.

The conference had two panel discussions in total. Arjun Kharel, Research Fellow, at CESLAM, Social Science Baha, initiated the conference with his welcome remarks.
